## Rainy Day Ramen and the Cosmic Pachinko



LOGLINE Can Fred, a broke, unemployed, drunken Gaijin, ever escape
Tokyo's neon undertow and find freedom from his own delusions?

**GENRE** Drama / light fantasy (magical realism like Murakami or Neil Gaiman)

**SUBJECT** Coming of age / guest for self-knowledge

**THEMES** The quest for one's identity and destiny; love vs loneliness, finding

self-love, regret over lost love

TONE The overarching mood is restless and anxious. Fred blindly gropes for happiness in bars, liquor and women, but can't find where he

belongs. Gradually he realizes he's never been in control, he is just another ball bearing falling though the cosmic pachinko and if he can accept that and let go, he may find redemption and happiness.

SYNOPSIS After 3 years in Japan, Fred Buchanan is broke, unemployed and

engaged in a telepathic turf war with a feral cat behind an Okinawa convenience store. Thus begins his metaphysical odyssey back to Tokyo. Along the way, symbols and sages materialize in the form of a two-fingered jazz musician, the faded tattoo on an ex-yakuza lover, an odd brood of internet café refugees, the kite flyer of Kabukicho, and Yukie, an alluring hostess with strips of delicious thigh. Charging through Shinjuku's neon jungle, enveloped in a boozy, nicotine-stained haze, past and present collide as an empty orchestra croons a slow dance of people and place, memory and madness, loss and love. Fred struggles to be an agent of his destiny and not

another ball bearing bouncing through the cosmic pachinko.

**CHARACTERS** Fred narrator, flawed protagonist, anti-hero, Gaijin, 28. He exists in a constant state of restlessness, ego, and self-seeking, and when

he encounters a series of symbols and sages, he is unsure whether he's losing his mind or is being guided by cosmic signs.

Yukie An alluring hostess, confident, independent and mysterious, who teaches Fred some valuable lessons on life and love.

**Hideki** An old man & former member of the student protest movement in 60s Tokyo, who asks Fred to seek out his old comrades.


Akiko Fred's former lover commits suicide; he must deal with guilt.

**Gertie** Irish girl. Fred's first good friend in Japan. Likes Fred but isn't shy about pointing out his selfish and self-centred actions.

Jae-Hyun North Korean refugee & former Pachinko boss, takes Fred under his wing & guides him through his current struggles.

**ENDING** When we leave Fred, he's back in Okinawa running a beach bar

with Hideki, making sense of his adventure and still trying to digest the life lessons learned along the way. He's by no means perfect, but he's learnt that he's never been in control, no life can be lived on self-will alone, true contentment comes from within, you can't truly love someone until you learn to love yourself. There is a planned sequel: a severed finger etched with an eye is delivered to Fred, which sets off a new odyssey from Hokkaido to Tokyo with new and returning characters and an all-new adventure ensues.
